## Thomas L. Reynolds Leadership Award

Honoring Excellence in Graduate Program Administration for Graduate Program Directors and Staff Coordinators

#### Deadline: March 1, 2023

Graduate Program Directors and Staff Coordinators play an important and pivotal role in the success of graduate programs. In addition to managing enrollment, Graduate Program Directors and Staff Coordinators must track and manage their students, while implementing programs and services to promote their success. Doing this well deserves recognition and praise.

This award recognizes excellence in the overall management of a graduate program. The winners will receive \$1000, an engraved plaque, and their name will be engraved on a perpetual trophy on permanent display at a central location on campus. The committee is expected to make **two** awards – one for faculty GPD and one for Staff GPD/Coordinator.

#### Criteria:

- Evidence of either growth in enrollment and/or improved graduation from the program
- Evidence of best practices as an advisor, mentor, staff coordinator, and advocate for students (such as tracking, nominating, funding, etc.)
- Effectiveness as a program administrator
- Evidence of efforts to improve the program experience for students
- Effective communication with the Graduate School and within the college

#### Nominations:

- GPDs and GPCs must be nominated, but the nomination can come from anyone (two-page limit)
- Once nominated, a GPD or GPC must submit a written statement reflecting his or her philosophy of graduate education and the role of the GPD or GPC (two-page limit)
- Include two letters of support one of which should be from a current or former student (two-page limit)
- The Dean of the College must endorse nominations. A simple statement of support is appropriate.
- Nominees must have served in the role at least two years in order to be nominated.

Please submit your nominations and all supporting documents using the <u>Nomination Form</u> by Monday, March 1st. The selection committee is composed of members from the Graduate School staff, Graduate Council, and previous winners. Winners will be announced in late spring 2023.

The Graduate School communicates specifically with McNair Scholars to encourage them to consider UNC Charlotte for their graduate studies, but GPDs are also encouraged to connect directly with the students.

#### **National Name Exchange**

The National Name Exchange was established to help match graduate schools with students from

historically underrepresented racial and ethnic groups interested in graduate education. The goals are to increase the number of qualified students from underrepresented groups accepted into graduate school and improve student access to information on graduate school opportunities. 
## **Education USA**



## Funding for Students for 2023-2024: What and How for GPDs

The Graduate School manages two types of funding:

- Money for tuition/health insurance/specific fees, which is provided directly to student accounts using <u>eGPS</u>.
- Stipend money, allocated to programs for their students, managed using the <u>Google Sheet</u>. The Funding Team enters the assistantship in eGA.

#### **Tuition Support Mechanisms for 2023-2024**

- 1. GASP Make three nominations in eGPS
  - a. Doctoral (research) students
  - b. Full-time enrollment (9 hours) or GRAD 9800, GRAD 9999
  - c. Hold a GA for \$9,250 minimum per semester, 20 hours/week
  - d. Full tuition paid Nominate for GASP Tuition
  - e. Health insurance premium paid Nominate for GASP Health Insurance Premium
  - f. Health Services and E&T fees paid Nominate for Scholarship Special GASP Addition
  - g. Up to five years of funding; four years for advanced standing students
- 2. Master's TA Resident Tuition (new this year)
  - a. Master's students
  - b. Full-time enrollment (9 hours) or GRAD 7800, GRAD 7999, or in the final semester (and student has applied to graduate)
  - c. Hold a TA for \$7,000 or more per semester, 20 hours/week, with specific course assignment listed in GA contract
  - d. Tuition at the N.C. resident rate paid Nominate for Master's TA Resident Tuition

- e. Be sure to inform students that *they will have to pay some tuition if they are not an NC resident*
- f. Up to two years of funding for new students
- 3. Master's Students Graduate School Grants
  - a. Master's students
  - b. Enrolled in 3 hours or more
  - c. For students NOT holding a TA that pays \$7,000 or more/semester this is a grant outside the compensation package model
  - d. \$3,000/AY
  - e. Nominate for Graduate School Grant
  - f. One year of funding, as budget is available

## Stipend Support, aka the Graduate School Lines/Positions (only)

- 1. Look at program positions on the Google Sheet
- 2. Enter complete information, and the Graduate School will complete the eGAs
- 3. See the Instructions tab on the Google Sheet for detailed information
- 4. Use the Google forms in the Instructions tab to make necessary changes
- 5. Make sure to *fill all Positions by May 15th*; after that date, unfilled Positions will be offered to other programs who need them

## **Academic and Policy Updates**

#### Automatic Graduate Faculty Appointments for new Tenure Track Faculty

The Graduate School is working to implement a process that would give all newly hired tenure-track faculty an automatic five year appointment as graduate faculty. Appointments would be reviewed after the initial appointment and could be renewed through a request submitted by the Department Chair. Contact Annette Parks for more information.

#### **Dual Degree Policy Revision**

As we prepared for the SACSCOC reaffirmation, we reviewed graduate policies to ensure compliance. We found that the dual degree policy did not fully meet the guidelines and expectations as outlined by SACSCOC and the UNC System Office and revised it accordingly. The proposal cleared faculty governance in January 2023 and now we are moving into the implementation phase. We recognize that this implementation will require attention from each dual degree program. The Graduate School will schedule time to discuss each program individually. We anticipate that the new policy will be launched in the 2024-25 catalog.

#### **Registration Reminder for International Students**

Starting Spring 2023, the following pre-pandemic regulation applies to both new and continuing international students: No more than 1 class in a given semester may be online and count towards your visa enrollment minimum.

Therefore, for new and continuing students the enrollment requirements are as follows:

- Graduate students: no more than 3 credits of the required 9/semester may be online. In other words, at least 6 credits per semester must be in-person or hybrid.
- Students approved for a Reduced Course Load in a given semester should be aware that, if you've been approved to take only one course, that course must be in-person or hybrid, and cannot be online.

#### **DegreeWorks: A Change for Fewer Petitions**

In an effort to reduce the number of course substitution petitions, we are exploring the possibility of automatically applying cross-listed and equivalent courses (as defined in the Graduate Catalog) in DegreeWorks. We encourage you to review the cross listings and equivalent courses in your department. Please note that incorrect entries will require a Curriculog proposal.

#### **DegreeWorks Progress Reports**

All GPDs and their alternate approvers should now be receiving the DegreeWorks Progress Report each month. This report offers a snapshot of student progress within a program including credits and milestones.

#### **Relaxing the Registration Requirement for Graduation**

While we are not broadcasting this change, the Graduate School will no longer require students who have completed everything to enroll only for the purpose of graduation. Most students will continue to enroll in the residency course in order to defend or submit their thesis or dissertation.

#### Joanna R. Baker Memorial Graduate Fellowship

A \$3,000 grant plus \$750 travel allowance for new or continuing master's or doctoral mathematical, computer science or information technology research.

#### Craig R. Brown Graduate Fellowship

\$2,000 grant plus NC resident tuition for a first-year U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident master's or doctoral student conducting research to address societal issues. Students receive in-state tuition also for year two.

#### DRReaM Graduate Fellowship

\$1,000 needs-based award for a continuing master's or doctoral student in a health-related program.

#### Faye Jacques Memorial Graduate Fellowship

\$1,000 needs-based grant to a continuing master's or doctoral student.

## John Paul Lucas, Jr. Scholarship For Educational Leadership

\$1,000 scholarship for a new or continuing master's student pursuing a degree in English or English Education.

#### Claudia M. Reynolds Graduate Fellowship

\$1,000 award for continuing non-traditional master's or doctoral students.

## Thomas L. Reynolds Graduate Student Research Award

Up to \$1,500 for continuing master's or doctoral students.

#### Zonta Club Scholarship

\$1,000 grant for new US resident master's or doctoral students.
